Foot Ball

Due to the combined efforts of Mr. Short and Mr. Anderson, a football team was organized in Barron High School, for the first time since 1913. Immediately after school opened in the fall, Mr. Short issued a call for all boys interested in football to attend a meeting for the purpose of deciding if they wished to play football. There were thirty-five who attended this meeting and it was decided to organize a team. Practice started the next day. This consisted of passing and catching the ball. As football was a new game to all of us, we were very awkward in our attempts to capture the ball. This lasted a few days when we were told to report in old clothes and be prepared for a little scrimmage.

We were a peculiar looking squad in our ragged sweaters and overalls and after each scrimmage we were a fit looking group of scarecrows for the nearby corn field.

After the suits arrived, practice began in earnest, and the squad had dwindled down to fifteen players, who remained for the rest of the season.

Our first game was at Cumberland, where football has been played for a number of years, with the result that a good clean and fast team exists. The first five minutes of the game found the ball reposing behind their goal posts, for our first touch-down. This was brought about by Irvin Cook's interception of a Cumberland forward pass, and the forty yard run through the Cumberland back field. Cumberland then got down to work and scored in every quarter of the game. After the smoke of battle had cleared away the score stood 6-26 with a victory for Cumberland.

The next Friday Ladysmith furnished the opposition for the team, on our own field. The first half ended in a scoreless tie. Due to a long pass during the third quarter we were able to carry the ball over the goal, but failed in the attempt to make the try for goal.

The fourth quarter Ladysmith came back strong, and we were unable to hold line plunges, which netted them a touchdown. They failed to make the kick and the score stood 6-6 tie.

Our next game was a return date with Cumberland. They came here in high spirits and the team was determined that we should witness their team when they are playing their best. Due to our team's poorer playing than in preceding games, and Cumberland's perfect team work, we were defeated by the large score of 39-0. This game proved to us that we had a great deal to learn about the game, and that we were handicapped by the size and lightness of our squad.

The return game with Ladysmith was played the next Friday, there. They defeated us by a score of 50-0. Ladysmith used their entire score of thirty men, and in this way we faced a fresh squad throughout the game. (Where is left tackle?)

November the fourteenth the team went to Glenwood for the last game of the season. This also being Glenwood's first year at football. We were determined that we should win. Due to an injury to Jenson's hand the day before the game, he was unable to make the trip. We started the game by receiving a kick-off, but were held for downs and Glenwood City received the ball. Fox intercepted a Glenwood pass and made a thirty-five yard run for the first touchdown. The next quarter, Fox made a drop-kick from the thirty-five yard line. The half ended with a 9-0 score in favor of Barron. In the third quarter Burt made a touch-down by a fake line plunge, and, in the early part of the fourth quarter added another by receiving a forward pass.
