FOOTBALL

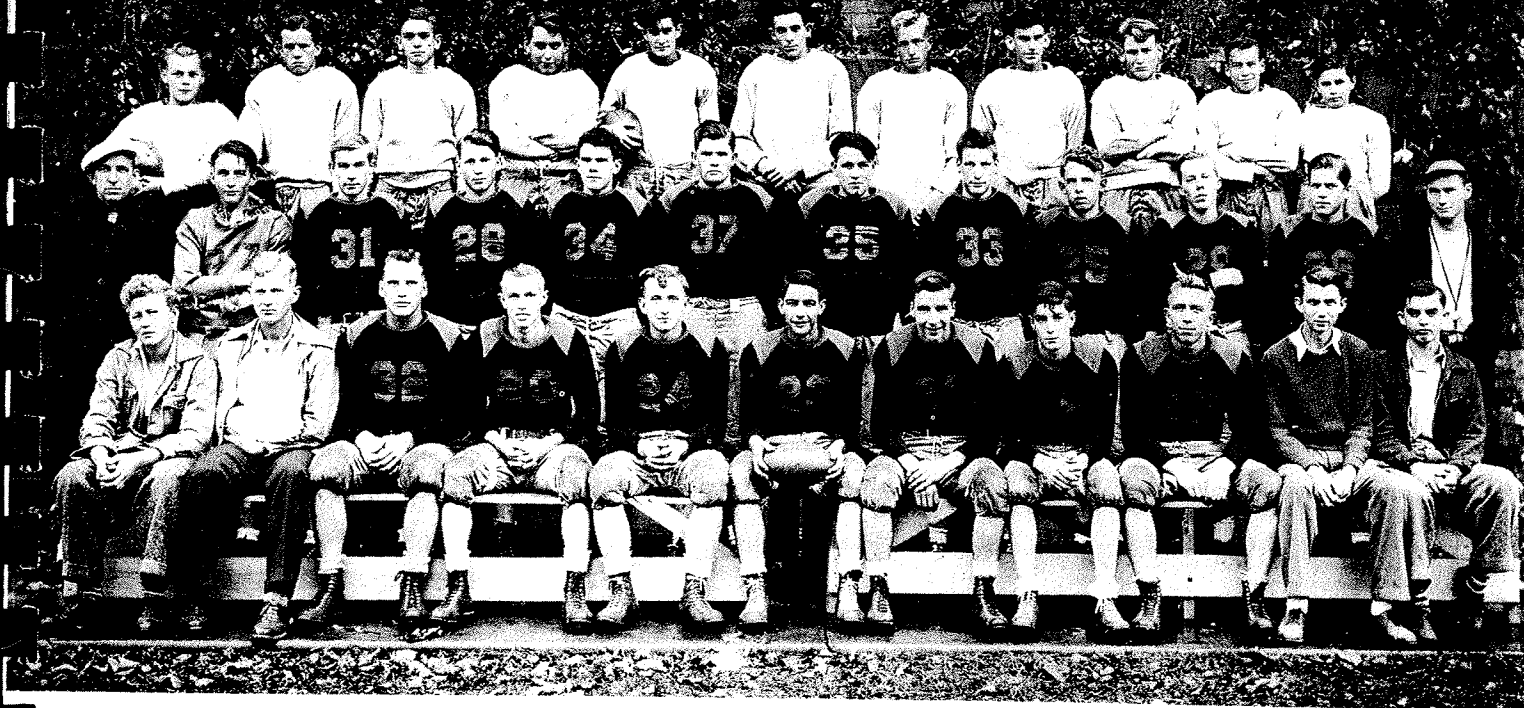

BARRON vs CUMBERLAND

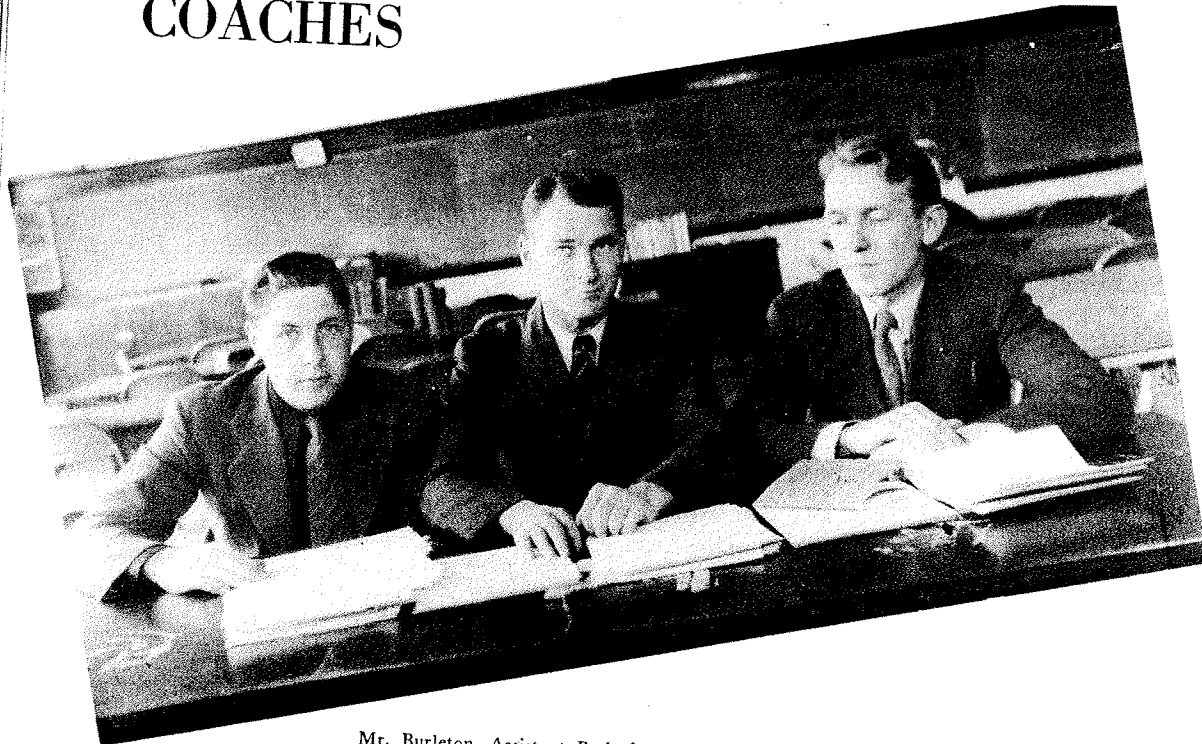
