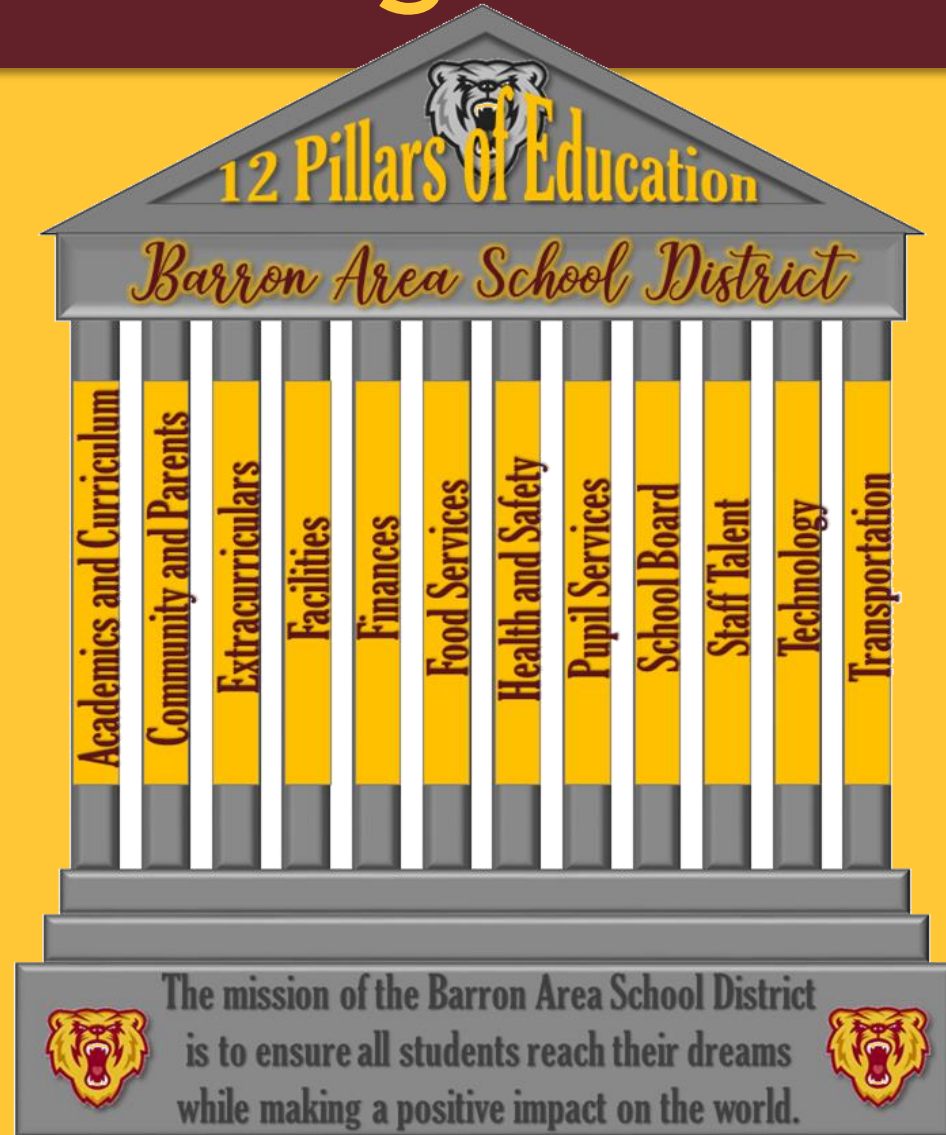

Academics and Curriculum



- Barron Area School District schools will score at least a 65 on individual building level report cards
- All district staff will be continuing to work on their Golden Standards and developing assessments that measure them
- Our ELA and Math teachers will be exploring and piloting new ELA and Math materials

Academics and Curriculum



- Woodland and Ridgeland Elementary Schools will work to continue the development of organizational framework systems and structures involving Conscious Discipline, PBIS, and Professional Learning Communities. A focus on cultivating a culture of collaboration will be a priority
- Riverview Middle school will always continue to look for ways to improve at each tiered approach for learning and behavior
- Barron High School will continue to offer both new and continuing teaching staff, the opportunity to complete peer observations as part of the Educator Effectiveness process

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Extra Curriculars



- Continue working towards 10% increase participation by Fall of 2023

Facilities



- As our new HVAC systems come on line, we will work with our facilities team to learn the equipment
- Plan to continue working with our Agriculture Department to develop and implement a forestry plan
- Continue working closely with architects, engineers, contractors, community, educators, administrators and our BOE to facilitate our referendum projects

Finance



- Manage and maximize referendum funding
- Continue to conscientiously innovate our health insurance approach
- Maximize and navigate ESSER funding opportunities

Health and Safety



- Implementation of work from our Critical Incident Training
- The school nurse will review and update district wide processes for reviewing emergency health plans, updating information, and ensuring accurate information is accessible to necessary staff members working with each student
- Emergency health response teams will be established at each building

Pupil Services



- Continue to seek information and resources in regards to alternative educational options and programming for students district wide
- Facilitate training for staff to identify signs of distress and provide tools to assist with managing mental health needs in the classroom
- Increase the number of personal mentors supporting students within our mentorship program by an additional 20%

School Board



- Complete our referendum work
- Continue our strategic planning process well into the future
- Continue to provide solid governance through our work updating BASD district policy with our contracted partners NEOLA and Lori Lubinsky, Axley Law
- Present at WASB convention

School Nutrition



- Continue to work closely with vendors to anticipate supply chain disruptions and provide seamless service to students and staff
- Develop opportunities at every school for students' voices to be heard, e.g., through taste testing and student polls
- Implement the Harvest of the Month campaign in conjunction with the Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program to promote the benefits of locally grown foods, create classroom-cafeteria connections and provide resources to families and staff members
- Create more content for social media to promote program innovations and benefits

Staff Talent



- District elementary staff and Riverview Middle School will learn our new academic and behavioral screener FastBridge replacing STAR assessments
- Woodland and Ridgeland Elementary staff will receive training and development opportunities throughout the year, to learn more about Conscious Discipline and other systems as previously mentioned earlier
- Riverview's PBIS Tier I team along with Mrs. Danielsen will be attending Tier I Training through the RTI Center/PBIS Network
- Our 5th grade science teachers will be trained and implement a science curriculum
- Riverview math and reading teachers will learn and administer our new Read 180 and Math 180 interventions during WIN

Staff Talent



Barron High School will work toward enhancing and reorganizing our Professional Learning Communities (PLC) process to focus specifically on the four essential PLC questions:

- What do we want all students to know and be able to do?
- How will we know if they learn it?
- How will we respond when some students do not learn?
- How will we extend the learning for students who are already proficient?

Technology



- Redesign of the district website to allow advanced mobility options for users and provide a more updated, user-friendly layout
- Implementation and ongoing staff training of the new BenQ interactive flat panels
- In an effort to continue working on security measures, two factor authentication will be added for multiple online sources and web applications (staff users) providing additional layers of user and district security

Transportation



- Improvement of 4k/KG transportation communications, data collection methods, and timelines to plan and ensure students are transported to desired locations as of the first day of school
- Continue to seek new transportation drivers by means of advertising using multiple platforms
