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## FALL BOARD UPDATES

### ACADEMICS AND CURRICULUM

We are continuing our work with Golden Standards which will soon be added to our district website. This work is being done along with our universal reading committee and is addressing disciplines district-wide. The purpose of this initiative is to create collaboration among colleagues and our community regarding the skill sets and knowledge that we want our students to graduate with.



We are excited for the launch of our new curriculum platform in January. It is a live District curriculum site designed by Ellyn Schneider. Our entire staff will be linking their work into our platform. These are living documents with continuous improvement in mind. In addition, we have teams of teachers, counselors and administrators meeting to analyze local and statewide assessments, in order to make data-driven decisions in regards to behavior and academic programming for our students. Some of the data sources we pull from are our Star reading and math assessments, Positive Behavioral Intervention System, Phonemic Awareness Literacy screeners and ACCESS data. Our staff has the ability to view all of this data in our district platform called eduCLIMBER.

### COMMUNITY AND PARENTS

We had Chris Kroeze perform for our students in all of our buildings this fall. Chris Kroeze's magical voice brought a tremendous amount of excitement, inspiration, and positive energy to our Golden Bears! 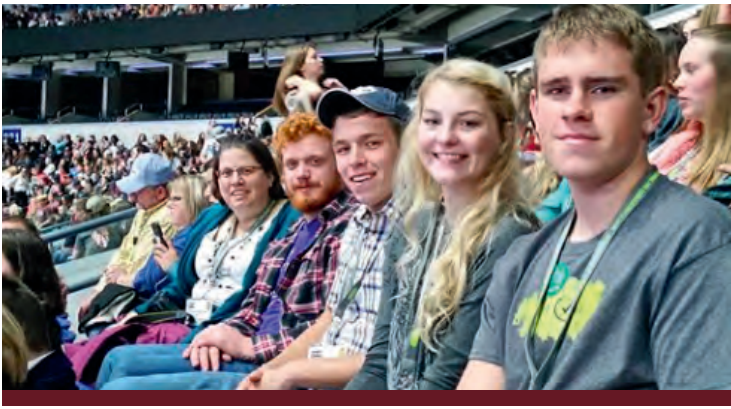

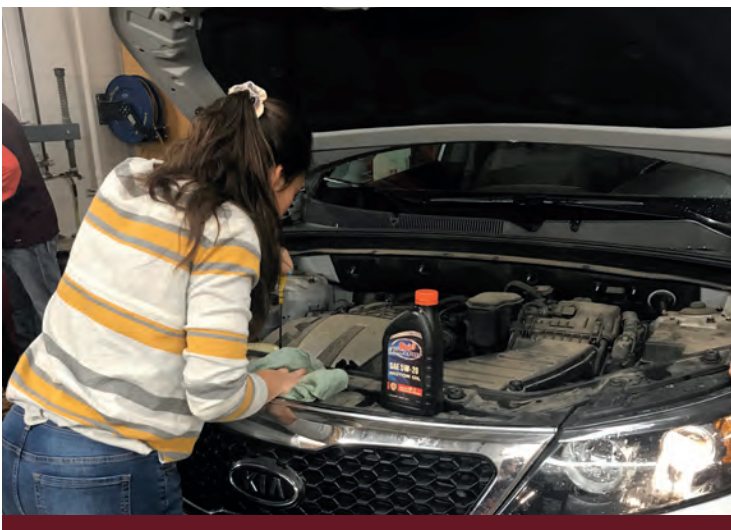

### FACILITIES

We are very excited about Phase II of our construction project which includes our agricultural, choir and band departments. This beautiful addition to our Phase I project is intended to further foster our student's interests and potential skill sets. Phase I included our machines, automotive, welding and wood construction programs. The final phases of our current construction project are intended to complete the wing of our high school, including our Online Charter School ALAW as well as our art department.

Our ongoing wood boiler repairs are continuing and include auger repairs. These energy sources have far exceeded their expected lifetimes, so we have had meetings with our consortium in order to develop plans moving forward. Our unique boiler plant consortium partners include our Barron Area Community Center and Mayo Clinic-Northland.

### FINANCE

State aid figures projected for this year are favorable for BASD, and we have high hopes that educational funding will be steady. I would like to invite members of our community to partner with us as we look at the future of BASD. We are in the process of long-term goal setting and the fiscal sustainability that accompanies this plan. ### FOOD SERVICE

Our weekend backpack program is successfully running at our elementary schools. Thank you to the Barron Food Pantry for their contributions, to Mrs. Mizer's class for helping to pack, Allison Rick coordinating distribution and Lynne Hanse for her dedication and commitment.

### HEALTH AND SAFETY

We are happy to report that flu shots were successfully given to all those interested in our district this past month.

With continuous improvement for Crisis Planning we have several initiatives underway:

- \* With the help of grant funds through the DOJ, our district is working on designing our entryways to increase visibility and safety.
- \* These funds are also allowing us to install new security cameras throughout the district.
- \* We are working on our plans for reunification drills this year.
- \* Deputy Dave is working individually with teachers to implement comfortable ALICE procedures.
- \* We have updated our field trip emergency bags to now have epi-pens in them.

### PUPIL SERVICES

21st Century Community Learning Centers Grant Update:  
 \* Chris Rolston and Katarina House attended the 17th Annual CCLC Grant Conference. The content was very good and much information was gained that will assist us in moving forward with the Boys & Girls Club collaboration for our after school program.

Special Education Mandated Self-Assessment Completion:

- \* The District has completed the mandated Self-Assessment with flying colors!
- \* The next self-assessment is due in the 2022-23 school year.
- \* Two district representatives will attend a DPI-sponsored activity where best practices are discussed. Our representatives are Katie Hanson-Mizer (special education teacher at BHS) and Brooke Kucko (district-wide speech/language pathologist).

### SCHOOL BOARD

### STAFF TALENT/DEVELOPMENT

Our first required teacher staff day took place this fall. Our focus continues to be our Golden Standard work district wide and our commitment to train our Trauma Sensitive Team in order to more effectively create universal interventions K-12, which address student mental health needs.

## TECHNOLOGY

The new WISEdata system for DPI collection is also a priority for our annual counts. We are viewing and correcting our data uploads to ensure that our state reporting data is correct. New collection deadlines are set for December 2018 so data will be in review until that time.

Infinite Campus has released a new app and mobile app for our students and parents. Campus Student and Campus Parent are designed to provide real-time access to student information by displaying what is currently happening in the classroom to help students and parents understand, monitor, and participate in the educational process. The new apps provide live data notifications in the areas of announcements, assignments, attendance, and grades. ALAW partners with two virtual education course providers; both have consistently achieved proven results for academic excellence, changing young lives for the better by tailoring learning plans to each individual child's strengths and needs. Connections Learning, the primary provider for grades K-6, and Brigham Young University Independent Study, the primary provider for grades 7-12, are industry leaders in online learning. They provide ALAW with exceptional multimedia coursework, as well as top-notch support for parents and students!

ALAW is not just a fully accredited virtual school; it's also a supportive family of exceptional teachers, dedicated parents, and students who gather to share learning experiences where the student is always the main focus. Our caring, progress-minded administration, highly-qualified Wisconsin certified teaching staff, and school governance board are working together to help each child succeed.

## **BARRON AREA SCHOOL DISTRICT PUBLIC NOTIFICATION OF NONDISCRIMINATION POLICY**

This policy also prohibits discrimination as defined by Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex), Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race and national origin), and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans With Disabilities Act of 1990, (disability).

### **BARRON AG DEPARTMENT RECEIVES \$10,000 GRANT**

The Barron Agricultural Education Department and FFA Chapter were recognized with a \$10,000 grant through the America's Farmers Grow Rural Education program, which helps farmers support their local rural public-school districts. They are one of 165 school districts in rural communities receiving grants to enhance math and science education.

The America's Farmers Grow Rural Education is sponsored by the Monsanto Fund, and since 2011, more than \$16 million has been awarded to over 900 rural school districts to enhance math and science education. The program was introduced in 2011 to partner with farmers to support their local school districts. The program offers farmers the opportunity to nominate rural public school districts to compete for merit-based STEM grants of either \$10,000 or \$25,000. Farmers nominate their local public school district from January 1 – April 1. After a school district receives its first nomination, the Monsanto Fund will notify them and encourage them to develop a project and submit an application that enhances math and/or science education in their district. School districts are responsible for submitting their

grant application by April 15. Once grant proposals are submitted, a panel of math and science teachers reviews each application and selects finalists. Then the Farmer Advisory Council, composed of farmers from across the U.S., reviews and selects the winning grant applications from a pool of finalists. Grant applications are judged based on the merit of the application, need and community support. Winners are announced in early August.

The grant awarded to the Barron Agricultural Education Department will be used to enhance the department as a part of phase II of the South Wing Renovation Project. Grant funds will be used for new department equipment such as greenhouse benches, aquaponics and hydroponics materials and upgraded plant science curriculum. The Barron Agricultural Education Department would like to thank all of our local ag producers who nominated and voted for our program to receive this grant; your support is greatly appreciated!

**HIGH SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE**

The Technology Education Department has recently undergone major renovations with Phase 1 of the construction process. Though total square footage has not changed much, the layout of the labs has created a more favorable and functioning workspace. The classroom yields to a full view of all the lab settings which allows many students to access the lab in multiple areas at one time. The renovated auto lab is now home to the metal working, welding, small engines and automobile areas. The new addition that was created adjacent to the existing building houses a wood-working/construction lab, classroom, mechanical room and a hallway that has bathroom facilities. This hallway will be connected to the high school at the completion of Phase 2. Though equipment purchases were limited in this build, we were granted the opportunity to purchase new welders to fit up the 10-booth facility. New shielded metal/tungsten inert gas welders along with metal inert gas welders were purchased to complement the uniquely designed welding stations that promote welding in all positions. The additional welding stations allow more student time on task. Adding more student welding time has given the district an opportunity to better follow curriculum offered in area technical colleges and provide more opportunities to students. This could allow dual credit certification in the future. The woods/construction lab is a spacious area. The design has allowed for safe movement throughout the lab while all the machines are in use.

The design goal of the lab is to be mobile and meet the needs of the current and future classes. This space will allow us to be creative as we continue to make storage improvements while getting acclimated to our new space.
