

#### **Facilities**

We are in the process of finalizing our long-term, facilities needs assessment. We will be creating a community task force which will include members from all of our villages, business partners and parents. We want to effectively team up with our stakeholders and work together to give our Golden Bears safe and supportive facilities into the future.

#### **Finance**

We were just recently awarded 'Critical Incident Funding' from the Department of Justice, which will allow us to move forward with our safety initiatives without impacting our operational funding sources.

We are excited to announce that we have landed reasonable bids from Rhom Construction and The Larson Equipment and Furniture Company for our final Phase III work for our high school remodel project. This summer we will be completing a final renovation of our high school art room and multi-purpose classroom space. Once this phase is complete, we want to invite our community in for an open house so that we can showcase all three phases of our BHS building project.

#### Food Service

Our Fresh Fruit and Vegetables Grant is remarkable, and kids are trying new foods each day. It is wonderful to see the kiddos snacking on fresh, healthy foods in the classrooms.

We have weekend backpacks serving 75 students, and we have recently received additional donations. We were also able to send home a little goodie bag before Christmas for each student. The charity that our community continues to display is wonderful.



#### **Health and Safety**

We will be partnering with a new company called NaviGate Prepared. This innovative, affordable company is going to help us create live floor plans for each of our buildings. Our plans and numberings have been in need of updating for quite some time. The purpose of this initiative is to increase clear, effective communications to our authorities, facility partners and fire departments. Safety is first for our Golden Bears at BASD.

We are holding another mental health first aid training for staff during our scheduled talent development days. We plan to have 30 additional staff trained to best meet the needs of our students.

Our school is also proud to announce that we are successfully implementing a program for trauma sensitive classrooms and will be training our whole staff in the fall of 2020-21.



#### **Pupil Services**

Our District assessments, STAR Reading and Math, screening window just recently closed, and our next step is to take a close look at our achievement data in order to help us make timely and effective instructional decisions. We are seeing noteworthy achievement and growth in our local data. These assessments help our teachers differentiate educational plans so we meet the needs of all students.

Our Mental Health Grant Team continues to work and organize opportunities, trainings, and student groups to support our students' mental health needs. A referral form has been created for use when a student and family needs more support and assistance from our Mental Health Navigator.

Our Mentorship Program, generously funded by Howard Whitmore, continues to expand, grow, and support students. We continue to get referrals for students needing mentors. Please consider this worthwhile activity. Please check out our BASD Newsletter for more information about this valuable program.

BASD and the Boys and Girls Club continue to work on increasing daily attendance and provide a safe, fun and effective space for students to utilize after school. Homework help has been implemented during the afterschool program, which has had a lot of positive feedback from staff and families.

#### **School Board**

We attended the Wisconsin Association of School Boards' Convention in Milwaukee this past month. Six of our board members and three administrators joined in on this professional development opportunity. The purpose of the sessions is to improve board members' knowledge regarding their roles and responsibilities to school governance, continuous improvement, community engagement and so much more.

#### **Staff Talent/Development**

Our Director of Learning and Assessment, Teri Massie, has met again with our grade level teams to review our achievement data and make data driven decisions that benefit all of our students.

#### Technology

We continue to focus on cybersecurity and training to better equip our staff and students to identify potential threats. The second cybersecurity training simulation took place, and staff are doing an amazing job identifying potential risks. This will continue to be a focus for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year with additional trainings offered. For our students, we continue to teach them social media and internet safety. In this day and age of advanced technologies, it is crucial that we instill responsible digital citizenship.

#### **Transportation**

Great things are happening in the transportation department! Shane Massie and Kelly Hover along with the support of Dale Lien are continuing to work with the transportation process by supporting the needs of our students and staff as they relate to transportation.

We currently have five interested sub drivers who are working towards getting their CDL who will become part of the Barron transportation team. If you are interested in serving as a sub bus driver, please don't hesitate to reach out to us and inquire.

We are in the beginning stages of upgrades for the transportation department radio systems, Wi-Fi coverage and bus cameras. This will drastically increase the effectiveness of our communications and therefore the safety of our students.

Our transportation department is meeting and communicating with our drivers frequently for round-table discussions to meet the needs of the students, staff and drivers.

### SUCCESSFUL SCHOOLS

The Barron Area School District was honored with seven awards at the recent Heart of Successful Schools conference. The Wisconsin Department of Education is committed to awarding equitable schools who create a learning environment where students are healthy, safe, engaged, supported and challenged. Schools who are awarded help students achieve their full academic potential as well as supporting students in developing lifelong healthy behaviors. ### **SCHOOL CHOICE**

School choice is the process of allowing every family to choose the PK-12 educational options that best fit their children. These options include various forms of education, from traditional public schools, to public charter schools, and online academies. Each of the options mentioned are offered within the Barron Area School District. Every child deserves an effective, challenging, and motivating education. Because each student has their own unique set of talents, interests, and challenges, a variety of options in education is crucial. School choice ensures that each student can find a learning environment that allows them to be inspired, successful, and happy. Barron Area Montessori School and Almena Elementary celebrated school choice week at the end of January by providing each student with a yellow scarf, making signs about why we love our school, and posing for pictures expressing the importance of choice for educating children.

Applications for the Barron Area Montessori School are currently being accepted for the 2020-21 school year. The Primary program, ages 3-6 AND the Elementary program ages 6-10 years of age are accepting applications at this time. At each level, Montessori hosts a 3-year curriculum. The Children's House meets the needs of children from three years of age through the Kindergarten year. The elementary program includes

grades 1-4. Three and four year old students follow a half day schedule five days a week. Five to ten year old students have an all day schedule, five days a week.

The Barron Area Montessori School is a charter school with no tuition. Enrollment applications are available at the Almena Elementary School office or online at http://www.barron.k12.wi.us/schools/Montessori.cfm .

Applications must be received by Thursday, April 30th, to be considered for the 2020-21 school year. Applications received after this date will be placed on a waiting list for 2020-21 or be considered for the 2021-22 school year.

### **CIVIL RIGHTS SPEAKER**





### **ACADEMIC DECATHLON**

On January 10, 2020, six Barron High School students competed in the Academic Decathlon regional competition held at the UW-Barron County campus in Rice Lake. Each high school team consists of nine fulltime students: three Honor students (3.75 to 4.00 GPA), three Scholastic students (3.00-3.74 GPA), and three Varsity students (0-2.99 GPA). All nine students write all the tests, and the top two scores in each of those three categories (Honor, Scholastic, Varsity) determine the team score. In this way, the program offers the appeal of mental competition to all achievement levels at any high school. Students take tests on art, economics, literature, mathematics, music, science, and social science. In addition, students are required to present both a prepared and impromptu speech, take part in a personal interview, and write an informative essay.

Two Barron students were able to stand on the podium at the end of day. In his first year of Academic Decathlon, sophomore Taylan Bakken placed third in the literature category. Junior Elias Mettner placed third in two different categories (mathematics and music). He also placed third with his speech titled "Nat King Cole and Eden Ahbez."
