







## How sick is too sick?

SYMPTOM:	Send to School:	Stay Home:
<p><b>Fever</b></p> 	<p>During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been below 100 degrees and no fever reducing medication has been taken.</p>	<p>During the past 24 hours, the student's temperature has been more than 100 degrees</p>
<p><b>Vomiting</b></p> 	<p>During the past 24 hours, no vomiting has occurred.</p>	<p>During the past 24 hours, vomiting has occurred.</p>
<p><b>Diarrhea</b></p> 	<p>During the past 24 hours, no more than one watery stool has occurred.</p>	<p>During the past 24 hours, more than one watery stool has occurred.</p>
<p><b>Pink Eye/Conjunctivitis</b></p> 	<p>Eyes may be itchy, but are not red, crusty, or draining</p>	<p>Eyes are pink, draining, crusty, itching, painful, sensitive to light, or student has vision changes.</p>
<p><b>Cough/Congestion</b></p> 	<p>Slight cough or runny nose, but no fever, and the student is able to cover cough, blow nose, and wash hands.</p>	<p>Symptoms are severe enough that the student is unable to learn. The student has a fever, or is unable to cover cough, blow nose, or wash hands.</p>
<p><b>Rash</b></p> 	<p>Rash is not draining or spreading. The student does not have a fever, and symptoms of itching are not severe enough to impede learning.</p>	<p>Rash is bothersome and distracting. The student has a fever or severe itching, or rash is spreading or draining.</p>
<p><b>Strep throat</b></p> 	<p>Your child may return after 24 hours of prescribed treatment.</p>	<p>It has been less than 24 hours from first dose of antibiotic. Sore throat is severe enough that the student is unable to learn.</p>
