
Academics and Curriculum

We are already finishing our first reading and math screening in all buildings. These assessments allow us to monitor the academic growth of our students throughout the year, to ensure effective data-driven instruction.

Extracurriculars

Fall sports are in full swing. I have had the privilege of attending events for Golden Bear tennis, soccer, cross-country, football, volleyball and golf. Our band was not able to access their instruments due to a construction project that interfered with this process and ability to prepare. We will make every effort in the future to be more proactive with communications and participation in all of these important community events! They are very important to us!

Facilities

Our High School Phase II construction project is successfully underway. This includes our agriculture department, choir and band areas. These facility upgrades are going to be 21st century learning areas that are conducive to student engagement. We are very excited to get our students learning in these new areas. Our teachers and students have been wonderfully flexible in that they are holding class in our high school gym stage and commons.

Woodland's parking lot procedural changes are going well. We have two adults outside in the morning between 7:45 a.m. and 8:10 a.m. to greet students as parents drive through and do not exit their vehicle. After school, two adults walk students to the drive-through lane and help get students loaded. Parents can still enter the building for various other needs, but they will need to be "buzzed in."

Finance

Our annual school budget meeting will be October 22nd at 6:30 p.m. in our Central Office Conference Room. All are welcome to attend.

Food Service

Our great cooking staff attended the CESA #11 food service workshop and food show in order to keep on top of the newest food service items.

We are also very happy to report that one of our 2018-19 annual goals has already been met because all of our cooks are ServSafe certified! The ServSafe Manager Certification is accredited by the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) under the Conference for Food Protection Standards. The ServSafe Food Handler Certificate verifies basic food safety knowledge and is for individuals in food handler employee-level positions.

Health and Safety

We are working hard to implement our safety initiatives toward meeting our goals for 2018-19. We have had the opportunity to apply for two rounds of grant monies that are specifically marked to improve safety in our district. Due to this funding source, our entryways are undergoing adjustments and renovations to assure safety for our Golden Bears. We will also be installing over 40 new upgrades for cameras in our buildings for clear visibility inside and out. In addition, we are looking to upgrade our phone communication systems and train a trauma sensitive team of dedicated staff members. We also have completed work and communications for all of our students who have individual health plans.

Pupil Services

Our Riverview Middle School Boys & Girls Club has a total of 44 members already and the 21st Century Grant is moving forward very well! We are now looking for a certified teacher to work with students on academic enrichment.

School Board

Our school board has been doing building walkthroughs on a monthly basis in order to assist in long-term facilities planning. We also rotate to our outlying buildings in Dallas, Ridgeland and Almena to hold monthly board meetings.

Staff Talent/Development

All of our teachers will be presented with an electronic curriculum platform that will showcase our Golden Standards for each of our classrooms and disciplines. Once we complete this living document, it will then be published on our website. The purpose of this platform is so all stakeholders can see our student performance standards for learning.

Grades 6-8 English Language Arts have participated in start-up training for My Perspectives. This implementation will end our district-wide initiative for upgrading our English reading programs here at BASD from Kindergarten through twelfth grade.

Our new district-wide mathematics curriculum, GoMath, has also held ongoing staff support and training so that we can best utilize all resources available to maximize student engagement and achievement.

Technology

Our awesome technology department has successfully prepared, planned and distributed all devices to students and new staff. We are confident that we have covered all of our bases for training staff this year in regards to electronically updating parents on a weekly basis regarding their student's progress in the classrooms. We have also decommissioned all of our old servers with the replacement of four new servers, and this process is ongoing. Our technology department has also worked closely on all school safety initiatives as well as new construction project tech needs. These items allow us to keep up with the ever-changing 21st century technology initiatives.
