
COLLABORATION CONTINUES

Barron Area Education Foundation

ANNOUNCES ANNUAL FUNDRAISER

The Barron Area Education Foundation (BAEF) was founded in 1992 by a group of people who had a vision to help students in the district reach their dreams by awarding scholarships as they pursued post-secondary education.

In 1990, Dr. Milton Kier, along with a School Board/Community Committee, began the process for the consideration of organizing a Barron Area School District Foundation. Wayne King served as a facilitator of this process.

In February 1992, the first Barron Area Education Foundation, Inc. Annual Meeting was held. The following individuals served on the initial Board of Directors - Bruce Kringle, Gary Borgen, Rev. Joel Helter, Robert Lentz, Robert Peterson, Dave Vruwink, and Leonard Splett. This initial Board of Directors, along with Wayne King, served as incorporators of the BAEF, Inc. Their goal of awarding scholarships to graduating seniors was set, and they began to brainstorm ways to raise funds.

The BHS Class of 1995 was the first graduating class to be awarded scholarships from the Barron Area Education Foundation. Funds from businesses and private donors helped the effort. It was also the spring of 1995 when the foundation, along with the help of high school staff, organized a Spaghetti Dinner for awareness and to raise funds. We are proud to announce that at the 2021 BHS Annual Senior Awards Day, the Barron Area Education Foundation awarded 72 scholarships to graduating seniors totalling \$93,490. The Barron Area Education Foundation is in the process of sending out

their annual fundraising letters to alumni, retirees, and local businesses (whose addresses we have located) to ask for donations. All contributions are tax deductible, and this mailing is our primary fundraiser. BHS Scholarships depend on these annual contributions. Besides awarding scholarships to graduating seniors, the foundation also sponsors district student fees toward educational camps, conventions and conferences. In 2020, they also started a podcast series featuring former Barron High School alumni.

We would like to invite the entire community to join us in our fundraising efforts by contributing to the Barron Area Education Foundation. Barron Area Montessori School

The Montessori classroom is set up to allow children to be independent and learn at their own pace.



Applications for the Barron Area Montessori School are currently being accepted for the 2022-23 school year. The Primary program, ages 3-6 AND the Elementary program ages 6-12 years of age are accepting applications at this time. At each level, Montessori hosts a 3-year curriculum. The Children's House meets the needs of children from three years of age through the Kindergarten year. The elementary program includes grades 1-6.

Three-year-old students follow a half-day schedule, five days a week. Four year old students may attend half days or full days five days per week. Students five and older have an all day schedule, five days a week.

The Barron Area Montessori School is a charter school with no tuition. Enrollment applications are available at the Almena Elementary School office or online at www.barron.k12.wi.us/schools/Montessori.cfm.

Applications must be received by Friday, April 29th, to be considered for the 2022-23 school year. Applications received after this date will be placed on a waiting list for 2022-23 or be considered for the 2023-24 school year.


The Annual Ridgeland-Dallas Parent's Club (RDPC) Kids' Christmas Shopping was huge success! Day
