

The lettermen of last season who were back this year were Curtis Martindale and Gordon Paulson, forwards, and Lester McDonald, guard. The remainder of the squad was composed of Raymond Hei, Kenneth Kuehndorf, Melvin Neumann, Glen Curtis, Duane Clumpner, Douglas Carlson, and Howard Mullen.

Barron played their first game against Chippewa Falls and were defeated in the closing minutes of a fast game by the score of 22-19.

In the second scheduled game at Spooner, we led until the last seconds of the game when a rebound was tossed in by Spooner to win 15-14.

The week after Christmas vacation provided thrills for all basketball fans as we defeated Rice Lake by the score of 24-20. and the following evening lost to Spooner

after two overtime periods were played and free throws shot. The score was tied at 15-15 before Spooner made three free throws to our two.
